In Phonics this week we will work with long vowels and learn a new rule. We will learn about <u>"sneaky e"-</u> sneaky e is silent, and sneaks by a consonant, and "scares" the vowel to make it say its long vowel sound. When a vowel has a consonant and a "sneaky e" after it, it is long and we code it with a macron. Our words to help us remember the rule are: **cake**, **dime**, **hose**, **cube**, **concrete**. Word lists will come home for practice.

In math we will be counting by 2's to 100, and making designs using tangrams (7 shape pieces- 5 triangles, 1 square, 1 parallelogram).

On Thursday we will be going to an Earth Day presentation about worm composting. Should be a fun, educational program.

In Math we will continue to practice using comparison symbols (<.>,=) and working with geometric shapes (cone, sphere, cylinder, cube).


Safe and Sacred

The Archdiocese of Indianapolis is sending out reminders to people that need to take or update training and/or their background check. Your certification will expire every three (3) years. You can either click on the link in the email you receive or you can go to www.safeandsacred-archindy.org. Please see below for a screen shot of what your screen will look like.

Steps:

Log into your Safe and Sacred account. If you need any assistance with logging in, please contact tech support as directed on the site. You may be asked to update your profile.

- 1. You will need to take the course (or courses) that are listed under the "My Courses" on the left side of the screen.
- 2. You will also need to request a background check. You can do this by selecting the "Click Here" under "Background Application"



St. Mary's will receive notification that you have completed the training and in about 1 week, we will receive your background check.
