In Phonics this week we will be working with combinations **ar, or, er**- keywords- star, horse, butter. (A combination is two letters that come together and make an unexpected sound.) We code them with an arc under the combination. We will also work with compound words. Please continue to read the "pop-up" words on a regular basis.

In math we will be identifying and giving the value for quarters and dollars. We will also work with numbers up to 30, identify equivalent sets, and will continue our work with addition and subtraction story problems.

In Phonics we are reading and spelling words containing the soft sound of the **letter g** (as in giraffe). We will also be learning "**Ghost Letter**" **digraphs kn** (as in knot), **gn** (as in gnat), and **wr** (as in wreath).

In Science we will be studying the parts of a plant and learning what plants need to grow.

In Math we are continuing to position numbers on a place value chart, and we are practicing how to add three single-digit numbers together. We are also identifying geometric solids and using comparison symbols (>, <, =).

## Safe and Sacred

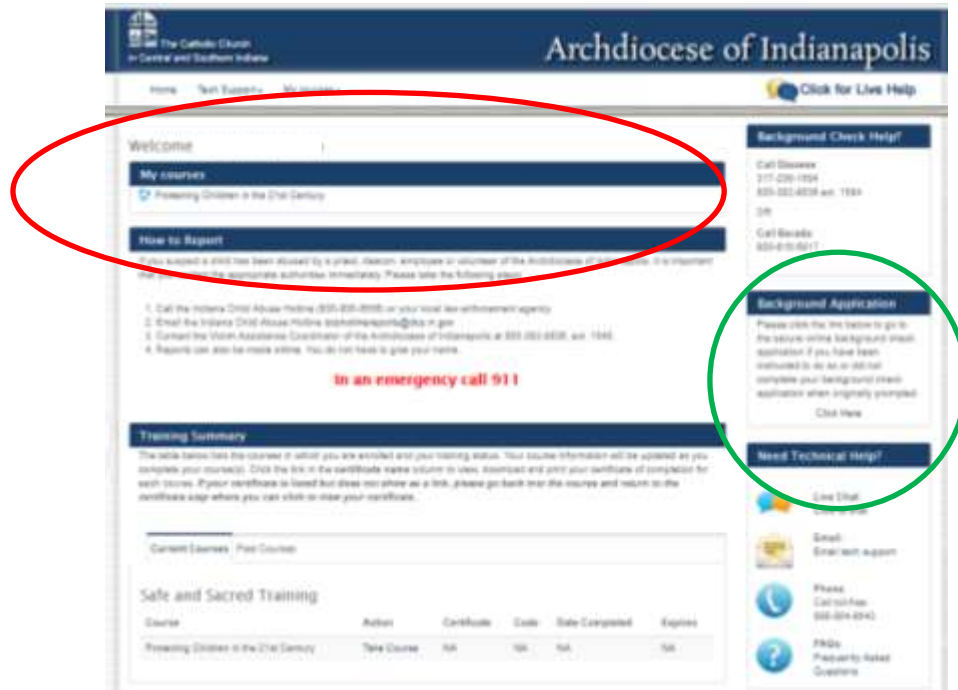
The Archdiocese of Indianapolis is sending out reminders to people that need to take or update training and/or their background check. Your certification will expire every three (3) years. You can either click on the link in the email you receive or you can go to [www.safeandsacred-archindy.org](http://www.safeandsacred-archindy.org). Please see below for a screen shot of what your screen will look like.

### Steps:

Log into your Safe and Sacred account. If you need any assistance with logging in, please contact tech support as directed on the site. You may be asked to update your profile.

1. You will need to take the course (or courses) that are listed under the “My Courses” on the left side of the screen.
2. You will also need to request a background check. You can do this by selecting the “Click Here” under “Background Application”

1. Take the class or classes that are at the top of the page.
2. Go to the right side of the screen and click on the “Click Here” under the Background Application



St. Mary’s will receive notification that you have completed the training and in about 1 week, we will receive your background check.
