In Phonics this week we will be working with letter Tt- (keyword-tent). We will be adding 4 new words to our caterpillar word wall. We now have 6 words that we can blend to read. It is very important that you work with your child on letter identification and letter sounds. If the children don't know the letters/sounds, they will not be able to blend to read. We will also begin to "unblend" our sounds in words to spell our words. Practice at home would be helpful.

Our snack sales continue to be great, but please don't send in other snacks without checking with me. God bless.


